**\*\*1. Discussion Questions (The "Opening" Chat)\*\***

- \* **\*The Mother Tongue:** What is your first language? Do your grandparents speak the same way you do, or do they use different words and accents?
- \* **\*Vanishing Words:** Have you ever heard a language or a dialect that is only spoken by older people? Why do you think young people are not learning it?
- \* **\*The Power of English:** Do you think the popularity of global languages (like English or standard Farsi) is the reason why local dialects are disappearing?
- \* **\*Loss of Culture:** When a language dies, what else is lost? (Think about stories, songs, and traditions).

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**\*\*2. Cultural Context: The Iranian Landscape\*\***

\_Iran is a "treasure chest" of languages and dialects. Use these points to start a conversation about the local situation:\_

- \* **\*Diversity:** In Iran, besides Farsi, people speak many beautiful languages and dialects such as **\*Azeri, Kurdish, Luri, Gilaki, Mazanderani, Balochi, and Arabic.\***
- \* **\*The Endangered List:** According to UNESCO, several Iranian dialects are "endangered." For example, some local dialects in the central desert or northern forests have very few speakers left.
- \* **\*The "Grandparent Gap":** Many students in Tehran or other big cities can understand their grandparents' local dialect (like Esfahani or Yazdi) but cannot speak it themselves. This is the first step toward a language becoming "extinct."

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**\*\*3. Key Vocabulary (To prepare for the reading)\*\***

- \* \*Endangered (adj):\* In danger of disappearing or dying out completely.
- \* \*Native Speaker (n):\* A person who has spoken a particular language since earliest childhood.
- \* \*Dialect (n):\* A particular form of a language that is peculiar to a specific region or social group.
- \* \*Preserve (v):\* To keep something valued alive or in its original state.
- \* \*Extinct (adj):\* (Of a language) no longer used by anyone as a living language.
