An opinion you give someone about what they should do.



Use should/shouldn't to give somebody advice or say what you think is the right thing to do

I

should / **shouldn't** + verb (infinitive without to)

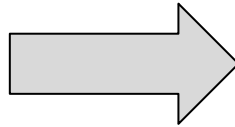


For example:

You should wear a suit to the interview.



You **shouldn't** drink coffee in the evening.
It'll keep you awake.



We often use “I think you should / I don’t think you should”

I think you should change your job.



I don’t think you should speak to her.
