

Lesson: Too / Enough + Adjectives

■ Marker Sentences:

■ Meaning & Form:

We use "too + adjective" to say that something is more than we want or need. Example: It's too hot. (= hotter than comfortable) We use "adjective + enough" to say we have the right amount or not. Example: He isn't strong enough. (= He needs to be stronger)

■ Form:

too + adjective + to + verb adjective + enough + to + verb
