- They gave **us** the Wi-Fi **password**.
- He showed **me** a new **app**

Structure 1:

Subject + Verb + Indirect Object + Direct Object

She sent me a photo.

Structure 2:

Subject + Verb + Direct Object + to/for + Indirect Object

She sent a photo to me.

Direct Object = the thing

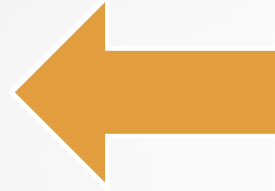
(photo, laptop, password, app)

Indirect Object = the person

(me, my brother, us)

Let's use it...

- He sent his mom a video.
- I showed my friend the website.
- They gave me the charger



DO: a video, the website, the charger
IO: his mom, my friend, me

- sending emails
- giving passwords
- buying devices
- showing apps
- teaching someone how to use something

I showed my father a new app.

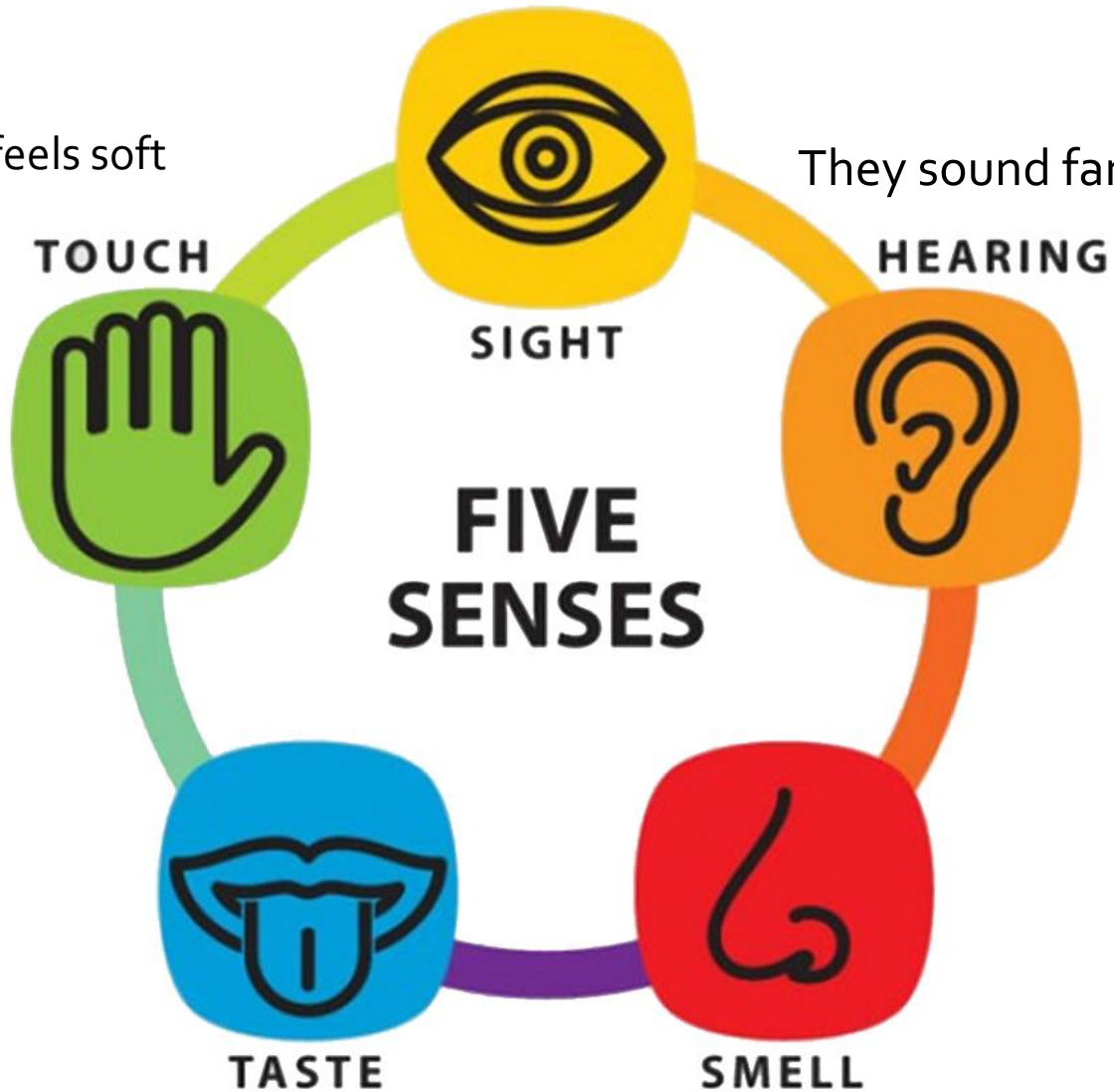
What do you feel?

I **watch** TV every morning.

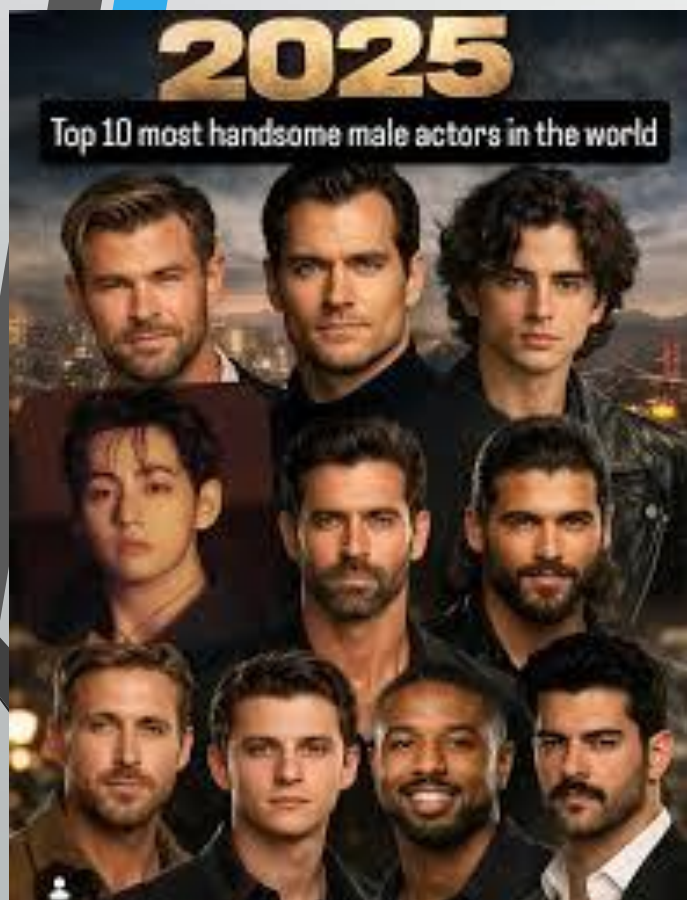
I **listen** to music when I come to class.

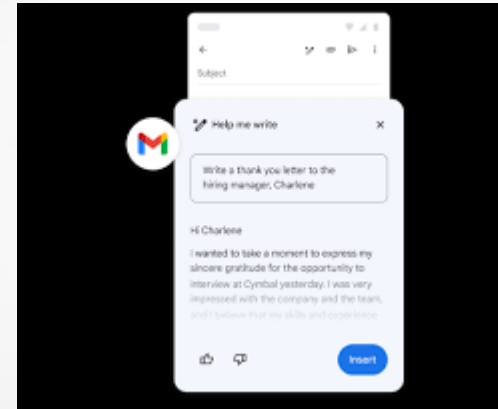

With **informal writing** (often to people we know well), we use shorter sentences and contracted forms. Sometimes we also leave words out.
