

expecting: (verb / adjective)

Story context: "now Mrs Taylor expecting another child"

Synonym / Paraphrase: going to have a baby / Pregnant

Formal vs Informal: expecting is polite, common way to describe pregnancy in standard English.

Word Fork: expect (v), expectation (n), expectant (adj)

Delighted (adjective)

Story context: he was not Delighted about the news.

meaning: extremely pleased and happy

opposite: Unhappy, disappointed

Word Fork: Delight (v/n), delightful (adj)

ex: iranians are ^{not} Delighted about economy

Suppose (verb)

Story content: I suppose we'll have to find larger house

Synonym: think, believe

Idea String: I suppose so (agreeing)

I suppose I have to (obligation)

word Fork: supposition (n), supposed (adj)

em: I suppose to do things in easy way.

Arrival (none)

Story content: making plane for the baby arrival

opposite: departure (the act of leaving)

Synonym: coming, Birth

word Fork: arrive (v)

Hopelessly (adverb)

Story context: it's house said pat hopelessly

opposite: hopefully

word fork: Hope (v/n), hopeful (adj), hopeless (adj)

poverty (n)

meaning: the state of being poor

~~wealthy~~

Synonym: Being poor

opposite: wealth

word fork: poverty (n), poor (adj)

wealthy (adj)

meaning: having a lot of money or possessions.

Synonym: Rich

opposite: poor

word fork: wealth (n), wealthy (adj)

Examine: (Verb)

meaning: look carefully to check

word Fork: Examination (noun), examiner (noun)

content: the doctor examined him carefully.

Trouble: (noun)

meaning: a problem

Synonym: difficulty

Willing: (adjective)

meaning: to be happy or ready to do something

word Fork: will (n/v), willingness (noun)
