Nurses: doctor/ engineers/ teachers

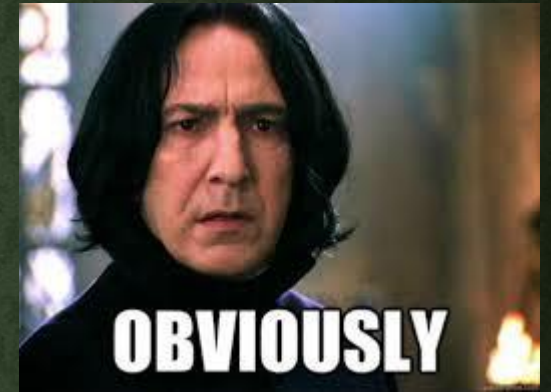
What is **Tori's** job situation right now?

ADD MORE INFO→ EMPHASIZE

- *As a matter of fact* or *In fact* to give new information that you want to emphasize.
- You can also correct what someone assumes or expects.
- *There's a real shortage of science teachers – so **in fact**, teaching might be a good choice.*
