How to make passive sentences (present)

Object + be + verb (past participle)

In passive sentences , objects are more important than Subjects.

To say about subject, use By + subject

Ex: When I arrive home, the food is cooked (by my mom).

Woman: Exactly! Just stay focused on the wonderful, satisfying life you'll have in the future.

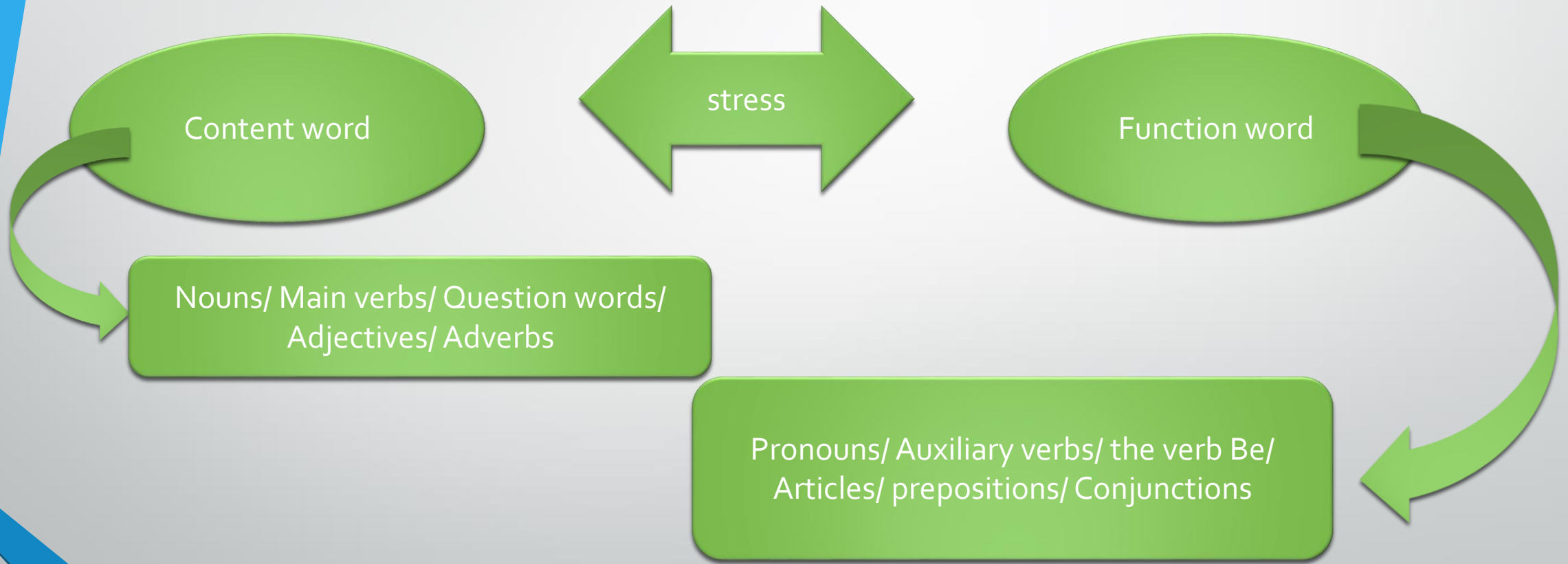
Man: Yeah... if only there were some way to reduce the amount of homework I have and increase the amount of free time I have...

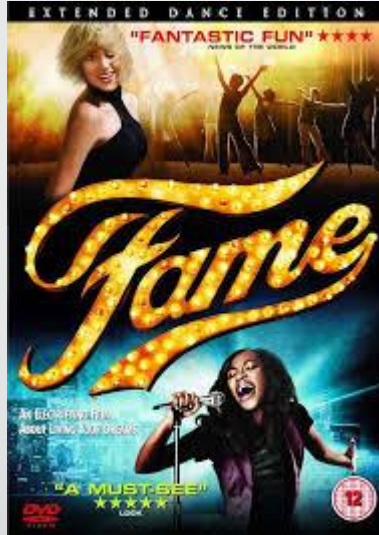

Using sequence words

- When you describe the order of things or the steps in a process, sequence words help the reader understand your ideas.
- **Sequence words:** *first, second, finally, before / after____, next, last, once____, then, eventually*
- **Example:** When I think about my future, I have some priorities. **First**, I want to get a good education. That will open a lot of doors for me. **Next**, I need to find a job. I plan to work for someone else for a few years and **then** start my own business. **After** that, I might get married and start a family. **Eventually**, I'll retire and let my children run the business.
